

## BPLC Launches EV Fast Charging Highway Corridor On Delhi - Jalandhar Highway

New Delhi, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), a 'Maharatna' and a Fortune Global 500 Company, today announced the launch of Electric Vehicle Fast Charging Corridor on the Delhi - Jalandhar National Highway with fast charging stations at 12 BPCL retail outlets strategically located along the highway (part of NH-44) as part of its initiative to address the range anxiety of electric vehicle owners.

The 750 Km long segment of NH-44 is the fourth such Electric Vehicle Fast Charging Corridor in the country, with fast charging stations at roughly 100 Kms on both sides of the highway. Chennai-Trichy-Madurai, Chennai-Bangalore and Bangalore-Coorg were the first three such Electric Vehicle Fast Charging Corridors set up by BPCL.

The EV fast charging stations at BPCL will help customers recharge their EVs in just about 30 minutes to get a driving range of up to 125 kilometers after which there will be another BPCL EV charging station for EV owners going further ahead. All EV customers will

be able to use the EV fast charging stations via a pay-per-use online service. The fast chargers can be self-operated without any manual assistance. Though support staff will be at hand when needed. Subhankar Sen, Head Retail Initiatives & Brand, BPCL and Gaurav Gupta, Chief Commercial Officer, MG Motors jointly announced the launch of the Integrated Customer Program in an event held in Delhi on 11th February 2023. ## Drone player Garuda Aerospace raises \$22 mn

Chennai, Feb 13 (IANS) Drone-as-a-service (DaaS) player Garuda Aerospace on Monday said it has raised \$22 million as Series A funding.

According to Garuda Aerospace, the funding round was led by Venture Capital firm SpHitiCap which invested \$12 million along with participation from other global investors, angel investors and high net worth individuals (HNIs) at \$5 million.

Another \$5 million in funding from an infrastructure development company, a group of HNIs and angel investors from India, UAE and Singapore was secured by the startup earlier.

The company will use the funds raised for scaling up and research and development for building advanced drone solutions for the armed forces in collaboration with global companies for the defence and aerospace sector.

The funds will also be used for the skilling and training of drone pilots and help create employment with deepening its footprints in Tier II and III cities.

Speaking on the funding, Anishwar Jayaprakash, Founder and CEO said, "Garuda Aerospace aims to sell 25,000 drones in the next 18 months and is looking forward to exporting 10,000 drones to about 100 countries in the next 18 months." Pallav Kumar Singh, Managing Partner, SpHitiCap said, "Given the evolving preferences and horizontal expansion with the usage of drones in several sectors, there is a vision of promising growth beneficial for both companies. With this, drones will be playing a major in nearly every sector in the future."

### ISB ranks number one business school in India

Hyderabad, Feb 13 (IANS) The Post Graduate Programme (PGP) from the Indian School of Business (ISB) continues to be ranked number one in India Global MBA Ranking 2023 by the Financial Times (FT) released on Monday.

In keeping with its consistent performance over the years in these rankings, ISB is the only Indian business school in the top 50 globally. It has been ranked 39th globally and 6th in Asia, the ISB said in a statement.

ISB is also ranked number one in India and 61st globally for research, reinforcing its vision of being a research-led management institution. This research ranking also demonstrates the quality of research output generated by its faculty year on year. Alumni from the PGP Class of 2019 were surveyed on a multitude of criteria for this year's ranking. The ranking saw ISB perform well on aspects such as salary percentage increase (2), alumni network (12), career progress (28), and career services (#29). ## Rents on Roll: NCR's Golf Course Extension sees highest growth of 18% since 2019

New Delhi, Feb 13 (IANS) Average monthly residential rentals in the top seven cities in both the luxury and the mid-segment categories, were on a roll in 2022.

As per latest ANAROCK data, the average monthly rentals in the prominent micro-markets of the top 7 cities increased by anywhere between 7-18 per cent in 2022 over 2019.

NCR's Golf Course Extension saw the highest growth of 18 per cent - from Rs 49,000 a month in 2019 to Rs 58,000 in 2022 for luxury homes of approximately 2,000 sq. ft. area. This was followed by Hyderabad's Jubilee Hills, which witnessed a 17 per cent jump in the same period - from Rs 54,000 per month in 2019 to Rs 63,000 in 2022.

Mumbai's Worli saw rental growth of 16 per cent in the period - from Rs 2.05 lakh per month in 2019 to Rs 2.38 lakh in 2022. Bengaluru's Rajaji Nagar also saw 16 per cent growth in average monthly rental values for luxury homes - from Rs 56,000 per month in 2019 to Rs 65,000 in 2022. Average luxury home rentals in Anna Nagar, Chennai rose from Rs 55,000 in 2019 to Rs 64,000 a month in 2022 - another 16 per cent jump.

Latest ANAROCK data showed that the key residential rental hotspots saw up to 23 per cent growth in average monthly rentals between 2019 and 2022. Noida's Sector-150 remained on top with monthly rentals for a standard 1,000 sq. ft. area at approx Rs 15,000 per month, from Rs 15,500/month in 2019. Pune's prominent micro-markets Hinjewadi and Wagholi

saw average monthly rentals for a standard 1,000 sq. ft. home go up by 20 per cent and 21 per cent respectively in this period. Bengaluru's Whitefield recorded approximately 18 per cent average rental growth in an 000-month period to Rs 22,500 in 2022. Prominent localities with high rental demand saw double-digit rental growth between 2019 and 2022, with Hyderabad being a notable exception. Key areas like Gachibowli and HITEC City recorded single-digit growth of 6 per cent and 7 per cent, respectively. Mulund in MMR also saw just 6 per cent growth in residential rentals in this period.

"Rental demand increased substantially in 2022," says Anuj Puri, Chairman - ANAROCK Group. "With more companies calling their employees back to the office, including in the hybrid model, rental demand is rising across the top 7 cities, after plummeting during 19 waves. We still recall the death knell being rung for the rental market in 2020."

## Tesla adjusts its EV pricing for 4th time in US

San Francisco, (IANS) Elon Musk-owned Tesla has adjusted the pricing for its electric vehicle in the US for the fourth time in just over a month. According to Electrek, the company began the month by executing drastic price cuts across its entire EV lineup, with the 5-seater Model Y seeing the largest reduction of up to \$13,000 in price. However, a few weeks later, the automaker raised the Model Y's price by \$500. Musk hinted that more price increases may be on the way as Tesla adjusts to the demand created by the massive price cuts. A week later, the automaker again updated its online configurator with a few more price adjustments. According to the report, moreover, the report said that the price of the Model 3 Performance has remained unchanged, and Tesla is still refusing to accept orders or provide pricing for the Model 3 Long Range. Musk initially stated that Tesla stopped taking orders for the specific trim due to high demand, but the report mentioned that Tesla is about to update the Model 3, which could explain the stop on new orders and the further price decrease as people may be hesitant to place a new order knowing that it may be updated soon. Last month, Tesla drafted a lawsuit to force the US to subsidise its lineup in the US and Europe, in an effort to boost sales as its stock plummeted more than 60 per cent.

## Piyush Goyal directs FCI to open more procurement centres in UP

New Delhi, Feb 13 (IANS) Minister for Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Piyush Goyal has directed the Food Corporation of India (FCI) to set up more procurement centres covering almost all revenue districts of Uttar Pradesh so that the farmers have option to sell their produce to it or to any other agency. Goyal gave this direction while reviewing the operations of FCI's Uttar Pradesh region in Lucknow. Taking into consideration the demand, population and vast geographical area of Uttar Pradesh, the minister said that more quantity of wheat should be offered in the open market scheme to control its market price. He asked the FCI officials to use modern technologies in foodgrain management and quality control to bring more transparency and minimise human interface. Calling upon all the officers to send their suggestions to make the functioning of FCI more efficient and modern, Goyal asked them to use their expertise in the field of foodgrain management and suggest better design of godowns in order to create higher capacities in limited areas of land. While reviewing the godowns of popt standard, Goyal said that all the godowns of FCI, both owned and hired, should be of highest standard. All the godowns of pop standard should immediately be upgraded by undertaking required repairs or else they should be considered for de-hiring, the minister said.

## Two-wheeler sales not matching pace of PVs, three-wheelers: SIAM

Chennai, Feb 13 (IANS) The growth in two-wheeler sales is not keeping pace with the sales growth logged by passenger vehicle and three-wheeler segments, said a top official of Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM). Referring to the January 2023 sales data of automobile manufacturers, Vinod Agarwal, President, SIAM said: "Better consumer sentiments is driving demand for passenger vehicles. Three-wheeler segment has gained traction compared to the past two years, but they are still to reach the pre-Covid levels. The rate of growth of two-wheelers in the recent year has not kept pace with the growth in the other segments."
